An increase in student enrolments may result in subject and timetable changes within each year group. If changes are necessary, students will be offered an educational program within the approved \$235.00 Voluntary Contributions. Instrumental music students may be required to attend a music option throughout the year replacing one of the specialist subjects. The cost will be within the approved \$235.00 Voluntary Contributions.

CHARGES

The term "Charges" refers to the provision of extra cost additional activities which are part of an education program and which contributions do not cover. Participation in these activities is conditional on a payment being made. Parents **are not required to pay any charge until notified** about the exact arrangements and finalized cost for each activity.

The estimated costs provided are the **maximum** and will not exceed this amount. If a particular event does not transpire within the school year no charges for that event will apply. Where the cost is less than estimated, the lower charge will apply.





The schedule includes costs associated with:

- Specific learning activities available to all students, but conditional on a payment being made e.g. incursions, excursions.
- Specific learning activities available to selected students, but conditional on a payment being made e.g. Music Program.

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VOLUNTARY ADDITIONAL REQUESTS

Each year the P&C endeavours to provide the school with resources that further support the work of the school and contribute to the wellbeing of your child. Recent additions provided by the P&C include refrigerated drink bottle refilling stations and table tennis tables. This is in addition to operating the School Canteen for the benefit of all students. Bullsbrook College P&C make it easier for all families to contribute equally by setting a sum of **\$40 contribution per family per year**. PAYMENT OPTIONS

We understand that paying these contributions and charges may at times place financial strain on some families. Therefore, we are happy to support you and offer the following payment options if required:

- Cash, EFTPOS and credit card facilities are available at the Administration Office during normal office hours 8.00am to 3.30pm.
- Money collection points are located in the Canteen and Student Services. Students are able to drop an envelope (clearly labelled with their full name, form class and reason for payment) with cash and/or permission slips securely enclosed.

- Parents may consider a Progressive Payment Option where Contributions and Charges can be paid off. Please contact the Administration Office to complete the Payment Arrangement Form and take advantage of this option. Alternatively, parents may set up a direct debit arrangement via their online banking direct to the school's bank account in part payments.





SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME

Parents who have students in Years 7-12 may be eligible for assistance with fees, uniforms and Contributions and Charges. Cards must be current in first term and include the following:

- Centrelink Family Health Care Card
- Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card
- Department of Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card (blue card only)

On 1st July 2024, the State Government announced the SAS Clothing Allowance, paid directly to parents, will increase from \$115 to \$300 for 2024 and 2025. Educational Program Allowance is \$235, paid direct to the school. Students in Years 7-12 and up to and including the year the student turns 18 are eligible. Forms for 2025 are available from the School Office and applications must be lodged prior to the last day of Term 1.

Deductions from Centrelink payments can also be utilised to pay for School Contributions and Charges. For further information regarding payment options please contact the Manager Corporate Services.

Parents are reminded that for convenience, Voluntary Contributions can be selected and paid on your Personal Items Lists. The discounted early payment price of \$188 instead of \$235 has been applied on the Campion order forms. Campion Education will forward the money to the school with a complete list of payment details.
